The Museum of Army Music also holds the stand banners and drums of old regimental bands.



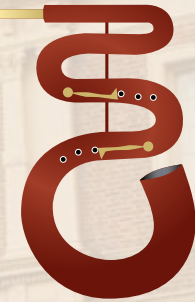
The museum has many interesting and old instruments including this serpent circa 1800.
